The 19th annual *Ham Radio University* (HRU) educational conference will be held on *Saturday, January* 6, 2018 from 7:30 am to 3:30 pm at the L*IU* - C. W. Post – Hillwood Commons Student Center, 720 Northern Boulevard, Brookville, NY 11548.

Presented in cooperation with LIU / Post public radio station WCWP 88.1FM (<u>www.WCWP.org</u>), HRU 2018 also will be the ARRL New York City/Long Island Section Convention, with a keynote address by ARRL Hudson Division Director Mike Lisenco, N2YBB.

## **Pearl Harbor Memorial**

Soon will be the anniversary of that December 7, 1941 " date which will live in infamy" (President Franklin D. Roosevelt). On that day Japanese forces conducted a surprise attack on Pearl Harbor in Hawaii. It will be interesting to hear and see how many radio and TV outlets give more or less attention to this event. Admittedly, 76 years since the occurrence is a long time to remember, even by those who lived through the experience. But to some of us still alive, the ensuing results of this event brought us into World War 2, which resulted in the death and maiming of so many and changed the lives of all. It reportedly produced what became known as "The Greatest Generation", publicized by writer and newscaster Tom Brokaw.

Years after a personal or world event some people say that not only do they remember the event but they can describe exactly what they were doing at the time the event occurred or when they first learnt about it. As examples, many recall their activities when the TV coverage or word of the fatal shooting of President John Kennedy became known and/or the TV views and coverage of the devastation on 9/11. In time I expect these too will be forgotten. I remember what I was doing on Sunday, December 7, 1941, Pearl Harbor Day:

On Sunday afternoon of December 7, 1941, I was in my Ham Radio Shack (bed room) in The Bronx copying code for practice from what I believe was being transmitted by Associated Press and/or United Press from MacKay Radio on Long Island. Heard was a message which was repeated over and over again stating: "PEARL HARBOR BOMBED THIS IS NO PRACTICE RAID". At the time I did not know where Pearl Harbor was, or the significance of the message, so I put the kitchen radio on radio station WNEW where Martin Block's Make Believe Ball Room was being broadcast, waiting for the half hourly news break. Shortly after, either Martin Block or another announcer interrupted the music and announced that the Japanese had bombed Pearl Harbor. No details given, the music resumed either coincidentally or intentionally with Hawaii or Hawaiian in the title. By the evening little more in the way of information was provided by the radio commentators. Unlike the President Kennedy and 9/11 events which were viewed by many on TV, not too many of the public became immediately aware of what was transpiring at Pearl Harbor. I believe I was among the first non Press people in the United States to learn of this surprise attack which brought us into World War 2.


