





#### Greetings:

LIMARC is entering its 55<sup>th</sup> year of operation. Originally formed as a 10 meter mobile club, with the introduction of repeaters and better uhf/vhf equipment, LIMARC evolved into an important mobile club emphasizing, education, public service, and the promotion of mobile amateur radio communications. As is the case with most organizations growth is also met with growing pains.

LIMARC is governed by three distinct but complimentary sets of rules. There is of course Part 97 of the radio communications act which governs amateur radio. There are certain specific obligations spelled out there. Then there are the LIMARC By-laws which sets forth the purpose of the organization and the organizational structure and how the club itself will be run. Finally, there is a set of rules relating to the proper use of the repeater.

To be clear, the FCC gives the repeater operator the absolute right to set rules of operation and furthermore, to exclude from its use, any individual with or without cause. There are as you know, closed repeaters for private use only; perfectly permissible. Without some responsible rules, there would be nothing more than chaos. The rules are there to ensure that several hundred users have access to the repeaters and can be comfortable with the operation. This is not a freedom of speech issue, but a courtesy of content matter.

When you join any organization you basically agree to abide by the rules of that organization. Sometimes that means giving up some of your rights. All is done for the benefit of the members and the desire to maintain an atmosphere in which members enjoy what is for all of us, a great hobby. Each of us needs to be responsible for abiding by the rules, and gently encouraging others to do the same. Often, the survival of the organization is at stake.

The board approved a motion to have Secretary Ken WB2KWC send a letter to Rich N2EO informing him that his discussion of medical and personal issues was in violation of LIMARC repeater guidelines (<a href="https://limarc.org/repeater-procedures-and-policies/">https://limarc.org/repeater-procedures-and-policies/</a>).

The Town of Hempstead has approved our request to hold a mini Field Day operation on Saturday, September 21 from 9:30am to 3:30pm at Veterans Memorial Park near the Levittown Library. Everyone is invited to observe and operate.

The next LIMARC Hamfest will be on Sunday, October 27 at Levittown Hall. It appears that most of our commercial vendors (Dave Schneider, KJI, Quicksilver and Radio Oasis) have said that they will be there. After the VE session there will be an educational presentation about Software Defined Radios by Neil W2NDG or Digital Modes including FT4 and FT8 by Ken WB2KWC.

Our next VE session will be on Saturday, September 14. Following the exam we will be operating an HF station for anyone that wishes to get on the air.

The board discussed the need to find a replacement for our Nominating Committee Chairman Ed KC2E who has become a silent key. Anyone wishing to assume this position or serve on the Nominating Committee please contact any club officer.

The board discussed getting better attendance at our General Membership meetings. We would like to find out what you are interested in and what you would like to learn more about. What is your expertise? Can you present something to the club? What interesting presentations have you seen (e.g. HRU).

**Technical:** Richie K2KNB thanked Lou NY2H for all the time and effort he has invested in running and documenting our repeater systems after the death of Eric KE2EJ. Lou said that the next step is to put the original equipment back into service with the new controller. Lou will be moving Echolink from his house back to the repeater site. Andy WA2CDL is working on the voting system; we are considering moving the NUMC voter input to Brooklyn.

The board discussed memorializing Eric by using his call KE2EJ on the 440 repeater.

**Education:** Lew N2RQ has been talking to other members of the Education Committee about putting a class together.

**School Club Roundup:** The October 2019 issue of QST magazine has the results of the February 2019 session of SCR. LIMARC is the sponsoring club of SCR. It was nice to see LIMARC members participate; hopefully we will see more club participation in future sessions.

**Public Service:** Ken KD2GXL told us that the next ARES general meeting is next Thursday, September 12. The next event ARES will be supporting is the Ocean to Sound Relay on September 22.

Good and Welfare: We are sad to report the passing of Ed KC2E. Bill WB2CUK is much improved but is still having some problems walking. Tim KB1HQJ is doing better. Best wishes for a recovery to Barbara, the XYL of Bill KC2SYL.

The pre-meeting presentation was by Bob W2OSR who spoke about the weather and recognizing signs of upcoming weather.

The meeting started at 7:52pm with the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance followed by a minute of silence in memory of those who died in the 9/11 attacks.

**President:** Richie K2KNB commented that we had a successful Field Day operating class 6A. Thank you to our Field Day chairman Rob KC2ILP. Our July 21 operation in honor of the Apollo moon landing made approximately 200 QSOs. There will be a VE session and HF station this Saturday. A letter was sent to Rich N2EO about his violation of LIMARC repeater procedures by repeatedly speaking about his medical and personal problems. The FCC will back up repeater trustees if they choose to ban someone from their repeater. N2EO has cost us approximately 30 members. This Saturday we will have a VE session and HF operation at Levittown Hall. On September 21 we will be having a mini Field Day at Veterans Memorial Park in Levittown. Our October 27 Hamfest should have all the professional vendors. The October General Membership meeting will be on October 16 instead of October 9 because of the Yom Kippur holiday.

**Vice President:** Bob W2OSR gave a summary of upcoming meeting presentations. In October Ken WB2KWC will speak about FT8 The November program will be nomination of officers and Directors. In December we will be having elections and the annual holiday party. Bob said that he will be retiring as Vice President but will try to arrange a program for January so that the incoming Vice President will not need to arrange a meeting the moment he takes over the office.

The business portion of the meeting was adjourned at 8:33pm and was followed by an ARES presentation by Ken KD2GXL.




It is that easy to donate. If you have any problems you can always email me at w2ctg@limarc.org and I will gladly help you.

#### SCHOOL CLUB ROUNDUP UPDATE

This is an opportunity to promote amateur radio among younger people. In addition to the entry categories for Elementary, Middle School, High School and College/University, there are also categories for non-school clubs and individuals. Without the many individuals, there would be few contacts for the kids at school stations.

There is an opportunity for a club entry from LIMARC. We need to coordinate the use of a LIMARC club license. As in some of our special event operations, we had member stations using a club station license in a scheduled rotation. LIMARC could have a credible and competitive score. Anyone interested, please contact Richie, <u>k2knb@limarc.org</u> or <u>scr@limarc.org</u>. This is important so that we do not have more than one station on the air at the same time.

Last February, we had a nice number of individual club members operate and enter. We would like to see more of you this October and next February. We will recognize the rankings of our LIMARC members' individual entries.

If you have access to a school or youth group, you might consider setting up a demonstration station and operating at some time during the SCR week.

There was a recent discussion thread on SCR-L@yahoogroups.com that was started by a volunteer at an elementary school in Maine. He thought that trying to get his young students into the October SCR session would result in "failure". The responses from teachers across the country challenged him. They said the October session is a great way for them to introduce new students to the on air experience and hopefully motivate some to get their own licenses.

Again we would like our LIMARC members to support the SCR. Paper logs may be used, but computer logging programs make our work in processing entries easier. There are several free logging programs including: SCR-Log, N3FJP, Genlog, N1MM and others that support SCR.

The LIMARC SCR committee would also like some help.

#### 50 years ago – from the October 1969 edition of the LIMARC Log

The meeting had Marty Siegel WA2FSD describe his tour of Russia. The club expected a large turnout, so members were requested to only invite two guests each.

There were two articles about modifying the D33 receiver(?) for 12 volts and adding an FET pre-amp.

#### 40 years ago - from the October 1979 edition of the LIMARC Log

Steve Place WB1EYI from the ARRL will talk about satellite operation. Steve is the general manager of the Oscar Education Program and Deputy Manager of the Club and Training Department at the ARRL.

Hank Wener WB2ALW, in his President's Message was requesting that individual LIMARC Members be guest speakers at our meetings. He also made a Proclamation at October 14<sup>th</sup> 1979 be designated as "John F. Gillen, Jr. WA2CWT Day " for his untiring effects on behalf of LIMARC.

Manny WB2BON spoke about the W2VL repeater which consisted of a Motorola Motran (30 watt solid state) mobile radio bought at a hamfest. LIMARC had a second one as a spare and was hoping to use that on 34/94 (or 25/85) as a portable and/or backup repeater. At that time the 449.125 repeater was also licensed as W2VL and was a tube repeater.

A computer net (to talk about the TRS-80) was to meet on the second and fourth Monday's of the month.

There was a proposed Constitutional amendment to add a Financial Secretary to assistant the Treasurer. A request was made by Steve Mendelsohn W2ML (sk) to support the NYC Marathon. LIMARC was promised the best positions in the race.

Due to the energy crisis, (and to save gas), the bunny hunts were temporally being suspended. There was also an Energy Net.

#### 30 years ago - from the October 1989 edition of the LIMARC Log

LIMARC was to hold a contest on building/designing home-brew crystal sets.

Bud K2PMA had an article entitled "It's a SMART MOVE" listing all the things a good ham should be and do.


