LIMARC Board Meeting - Draft Version

October 2, 2019

Officers present: President - Richie K2KNB, Vice President – Bob W2OSR, Secretary – Ken WB2KWC, Treasurer – Jerry WB2ZEX

Directors present: Jim KD2EDX, Ken KD2GXL, George WB2IKT

Guests present: Lou NY2H, Steve WB2KDG, Bill KC2SYL, Jim W2KFV, Lew N2RQ

The meeting started at 7:37pm with approval of the September Draft Board Minutes as published in the Log.

The board discussed problems that we have been having with Rich N2EO. LIMARC is down about 60 members because of problems that we have had with K6DPZ and N2EO. The board voted to suspend the repeater privileges of N2EO for 30 days because he has "acted in a manner detrimental to LIMARC and/or amateur radio". The actions referred to are:

- When advised by mail that some of his transmissions were against the club policy prohibiting "Discussion of a personal or intimate nature such as detailed medical conditions, disabilities, aliments", N2EO responded via email with an obscenity and asked why we sent him an abusive letter.
- N2EO threatened to report K2KNB's business to the IRS.
- N2EO emailed K2KNB that he hoped he died from cancer
- N2EO has subjected the W2VL listeners to a discussion on how to clean up cat poop
- N2EO said that he would not rejoin LIMARC but would continue to use our repeaters

The ARRL has started to implement the Volunteer Monitor program that replaces the Official Observer (OO) program. The league advises all hams to "clean our own house" before complaining to the FCC.

Gladys KC2YFT has been appointed as LIMARC Election Committee Chairperson. At the December LIMARC meeting, we will be voting for all officers' positions plus the directors' positions currently held by George WB2IKT, Jim KD2EDX, and Martin W1EMR. Anyone wishing to run for these positions (including the incumbents) must complete the self-nomination form on the LIMARC website prior to November 6th. After that you need at least one other person to nominate you at the November general membership meeting.

Hamfest: The Town of Hempstead has notified us that no parking is permitted beyond the back door at Levittown Hall. Previously some vendors parked on the sidewalk in front of Levittown Hall to unload their goods. We have notified the vendors that this is not permitted and we will provide help unloading their vehicles.

LIMARC web site: Recently we experienced an outage on the LIMARC web site while moving to a new server. The surveys and forms on the site are being moved from Spice forms to Google forms.

Vice President: Bob W2OSR said that in October he will provide the pre-meeting program on audio interfaces for digital modes. Ken WB2KWC will give the main presentation on FT8. The November presentation will be on building computers. In December we will be having our annual holiday party. (Continued on page 4)

Treasurer: Jerry WB2ZEX presented the 2020 budget which was approved by the board. We have \$8,908.19 in the checking account, \$781.15 in PayPal, and \$2,180.21 if the memorial funds for a total of \$11,869.55.

Membership: We have 348 members for 2019 and 75 for 2020.

Technical: NY2H is waiting for Steve Druckman to switch back to our original repeater equipment. The Newsline audio is currently being routed through Echolink. The distorted audio issue reported by Andy WA2CDL has been fixed by resetting the controller. We are working on fixing some link issues.

Public Service: Jim W2KFV said that the Volunteer Monitor program will be going live starting October 1st and the OO program will be disbanded. ARES has updated some of its classes and published a new training handbook. Jim reminded us that HRU will be on January 4, 2020 at the same CW Post location that it was in 2019.

ARES: Ken KD2GXL told us that the Ocean to Sound Relay went well and made use of mesh networking. The ACS walk will be on October 20.

Levittown Library: Lew N2RQ told us that the Levittown Library amateur radio exhibit went well. Our mini Field Day attracted 7 members and we even made a satellite QSO.

Jammers: We know the locations of 3 jammers based on our Greensky system.

School Club Roundup: Lew N2RQ reminded us that SCR is the week of October 21-25. Hopefully there will be participation from LIMARC members.

Field Day: Bill KC2SYL told us that Field Day 2020 will be the weekend of June 27-28. Planning meetings will begin soon.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:14pm.

Votes/Actions:

1 – The board voted to suspend the repeater privileges of N2EO for 30 days because he has "acted in a manner detrimental to LIMARC and/or amateur radio".

2 - The Proposed 2020 Budget was approved by the Board.

LIMARC General Meeting

October 16, 2019

The pre-meeting presentation was by Bob W2OSR who told us about some audio interfaces for digital modes on ham radio.

The meeting started at 7:55pm with the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

President Richie K2KNB told us that Hal K6DPZ has been fined \$17,000 by the FCC. This is not a joyous occasion but Hal has done harm to LIMARC; has discouraged membership and caused malicious interference to communications on our repeaters. This action shows that the FCC recognizes the right of repeater owners to control who has access to their repeaters.

Richie K2KNB told the membership that we are currently having problems with Rich N2EO. He has cursed and wished death to members of the board as well as cost us members because people do not want to be on a repeater when N2EO is on. At the October board meeting the board voted to suspend N2EO's repeater privileges for 30 days.

Richie reminded us that the next Hamfest will be on Sunday October 27. The only spaces available are on the stage. Our commercial vendors (KJI, Quicksilver, Dave Schneider, and Radio Oasis) have said that they will be there. We have received a call from the Town of Hempstead telling us that vendors may not park on the sidewalk in front of the hall to unload. LIMARC will provide assistance to help vendors unload. Because early voting will be using the small meeting room the VE session has been moved to 9:00am.

Elections for all LIMARC officers and some board positions (those currently held by George WB2IKT, Jim KD2EDX, and Martin W1EMR) will be voted on at the December meeting. You can self-nominate using the form on the LIMARC web site until the November board meeting. After that you must be nominated from the floor at the November General Membership meeting. All candidates must be 18 years old and have been a LIMARC member for at least 1 year by January 1, 2020.

If you are unsure if you want to run for office you can become a member of one of the LIMARC committees. We need chairpersons for our Hamfest and Merchandise Committees.

Bob W2OSR said that the programs for the November General Membership meeting will be the nomination of officers and board members as well as a presentation by Craig KD2OGB on building computers.

Gary W2MIT will be creating a survey on what members would like to see as meeting presentations. One of the suggested topics is installing equipment in your car/truck. You can register on the LIMARC web site. If you have any questions please contact <u>W2MIT@limarc.org</u>.

Richie K2KNB repeated how grateful we are to Lou NY2H for taking over the care and feeding of our repeaters. Thank you also to Steve WB2ZSE, Steve WB2WAK, Andy WA2CDL and John KD2AKX for their work on our repeater systems.

Dave AD8B, the author of the SCR-Log program is now a silent key. His son is helping us find all of the files involved so that the program can be maintained.

JOTA: Bob W2OSR reminded us that JOTA is this weekend.

Lew N2RQ told us that the Michigan State University (W8MS) 100th anniversary event will be this Friday. The NY State QSO Party will be this weekend.

New business: George WB2IKT asked if we could livestream the LIMARC general membership and board meetings. This was tabled until the next board meeting.

The business portion of the meeting was adjourned at 8:45pm and was followed by a presentation on FT-8 by Ken WB2KWC.

FCC Proposes \$17,000 Fine For LGNARC Repeater Jammer Mel KS2G

The Enforcement Bureau of the Federal Communications Commission has proposed a \$17,000 "monetary forfeiture" –in other words a fine— on Hal Guretzky, K6DPZ, for repeated jamming of the LIMARC W2VL 2-meter repeater.

In an October 3rd *Notice of Apparent Liability of Forfeiture* (NAL), the Commission says that after receiving numerous complaints that Hal was causing intentional interference on the 146.25/85 machine, the Enforcement Bureau issued a Warning Letter advising him of the nature of the allegations against him and directing him to refrain from using the repeater going forward.

Summarizing the rest of the enforcement action described in the NAL on its web site, the ARRL wrote;

After the FCC received further complaints regarding Guretzky's continued operation on the local repeater, an Enforcement Bureau agent again drove to [Hal's QTH in] Richmond Hill to investigate. The agent monitored the VHF repeater's input and output frequencies and, after observing deliberate interference to other stations, used direction-finding techniques to identify the source of the transmission as Guretzky's station.

"The agent monitored and recorded the transmissions emanating from Guretzky's station for several hours that afternoon and heard him interfering with the local repeater," the NAL said. "Later, the agent heard Guretzky making threatening comments toward other amateur operators. These transmissions were a deliberate act to control the frequency and prevent other Amateur Radio operators from conducting legitimate communications."

The following month, FCC Regional Director David Dombrowski spoke with Guretzky via telephone, noting that the Commission was still receiving complaints about his continued use of the repeater and cautioning him against using the repeater.

In describing the size of fine, the NAL states that the FCC rules set "a base forfeiture of \$7,000 for each day for causing interference to authorized stations." But it goes on to say that "given the totality of the circumstances [the Commission concluded] that a significant upward adjustment [was] warranted."

Citing Hal's continued willful interference despite receiving two written notifications and one oral notification from the Commission to cease his activity, the FCC determined that its rules "warrant an upward adjustment of \$10,000 to the proposed forfeiture."

In an October 5th e-mail to the membership, LIMARC president Richie Cetron, K2KNB, noted:

I don't think that there is any real pleasure to be had here. Many of our members do not know that Hal is currently in hospice which never ends well. All of his equipment was sold at online auctions, and to the best of my knowledge, his two homes and his plane are all gone. It is not something that we would wish on anyone.

Hal began to lose control of his actions. He was at times totally irrational. Not only did he deliberately interfere with the activities on the repeater, but his interference included some of the most vile language that made it impossible for anyone to listen to the repeater. While sad, we could not allow it to be our problem as we lost many members due to his actions. As you read the FCC report, you can see the attempt on their part to advise him to stop but with his continued actions the FCC was left no choice but to undertake a full investigation resulting in the fine,.

It is important to note that the FCC does care about amateur radio but that it also has to prioritize its activities. Also, even though there are valid complaints filed with them, they are the ones that must compile direct evidence of the violations. That can take some time. However, they will get to them, and that should serve as a reminder to those who continue to violate enforceable actions such as deliberate interference or continuing to use the repeater having been advised by the repeater owners to stop.

Sadly, Hal's legacy will be this notice of forfeiture from the FCC rather than the recognition of his ability to explain radio and help new hams.

The guest speaker for the meeting was an oil company service supervisor discussing "Energy Saving Devices".

Speaking of energy, the LIMARC Energy Net was mentioned in an August 17th Newsday article written by LIMARC President Hank WB2ALW.

There was going to be a vote on a Constitution revision at the November meeting to reduce the quorum from 15% to 10%. In an article by Steve Mendelsohn (WA2DHF) -W2ML (sk), he started out with the fact that 500 logs are mailed out, but less than 100 members show up at the general meetings *(comment: we should be that lucky now!)*. He then went on to mention various excuses why members do not show up at the meetings.

LIMARC participated in a hobby show sponsored by HARC (Hudson Amateur Radio Council), held at Nassau Coliseum.

30 years ago – from the November 1989 edition of the LIMARC Log

The program was a film on a DXpedition to Kingsman Reef.

There was a reprinted article about eye injuries caused by a welding spark and an electrical spark happening to two workers wearing contact lens.

There was also an article about hams in Air Force Mars involved with Hurricane Hugo. There was also article about home brewing an antenna *(the author's name was unreadable in the scan)*.

20 years ago - from the November 1999 edition of the LIMARC Log

Rob N1XL mentioned in the President's Message the same statement they we say today is that LIMARC runs neither open or closed repeaters, but club repeaters. 


